<b>PROGRAM BASICS</b>	The Indianapolis EMS (IEMS) Paramedic Science Program in partnership with Eskenazi Health, is a 52-week program is designed to present subject matter in a section- or shift-accommodating manner to make attendance convenient for EMS and fire department personnel. Classes are held from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. Lectures are held in the Indianapolis EMS Education Center. The faculty also integrates web-based teaching and learning resources so students can log on from home to access syllabi, presentations, grades and student-to-faculty communication.

### **MORE ABOUT THE IEMS ESKENAZI HEALTH PARAMEDIC SCIENCE PROGRAM**

Students benefit from an unequalled field internship with Indianapolis EMS – the largest EMS agency in Marion County. Indianapolis EMS has more than 200 pre-hospital healthcare providers who respond to nearly 120,000 911 calls each year. Indianapolis EMS traces its roots back to 1887, making it the oldest and most experienced ambulance service in the state.

Students spend the majority of hospital clinical rotations at Sidney & Lois Eskenazi Hospital, a state-of-the-art, 315-bed public hospital in the heart of downtown Indianapolis. Indiana University School of Medicine (IUSM) physicians specializing in emergency medicine and surgical trauma lead the Michael & Susan Smith Emergency Department and Smith Level I Shock Trauma Center at Eskenazi Health – one of three adult level one trauma centers in the state. Our students are also required to complete shifts in other departments at Eskenazi, at Riley Hospital for Children (the only pediatric level one trauma center in Indiana), and in a variety of other settings in the central Indiana area. This access allows students to perfect patient assessment and management skills with a wide variety of patients while interacting with staff in the following places:
